Shifting the paradigm

Without the appropriate measurements it is difficult to understand whether our actions are helping or hindering us in the achievement of our goals. IEP's empirical processes and metrics for studying peace are filling a gap -prior to the Global Peace Index there was no standardized measure of national peacefulness.

Through IEP's focus on uncovering positive peace, those factors that create peaceful and resilient countries, we are shifting the paradigm from just containing violence to building societies that perform better in many key areas, such as strong business environments and ecological sustainability. Positive peace creates the optimal environment for human potential to flourish.

IEP is a proven leader in the development of indices to measure peace at the global, national and metropolitan levels. (Read more online: Global Peace Index; Mexico Peace Index, US Peace Index, UK Peace Index) It also develops original conceptual frameworks to understand positive peace as well as measure the economic benefits that would derive from increased peacefulness. Making peace relevant



Peace Metrics

GLOBAL PEACE INDEX (GPI)

The GPI is the world's leading measure of peace. Produced annually since 2007, it ranks 162 countries on their levels of internal and external peacefulness. The GPI is developed by IEP under the guidance of an international panel of experts with data jointly collated and calculated with the Economist Intelligence Unit.

The Index measures relative states of peace, investigates potential determinants of peace and creates a framework to track and compare levels of peace over time.

NATIONAL PEACE INDICES

A series of country-level indices that provide an in-depth analysis of peace and allow regional differences within countries to be measured. These indices identify key socio-economic factors that are strongly associated with peace and estimate the economic impact of peace at regional levels. National indices include the US Peace Index, UK Peace Index and Mexico Peace Index.

GLOBAL TERRORISM INDEX (GTI)

A comprehensive measure of the direct impact of terrorism worldwide in terms of lives lost, injuries, property damage and number of incidents.

Based on data from the Global Terrorism Database (GTD) the GTI provides the evidence-base to better understand the patterns, tactics and drivers behind terrorist activity.

Positive Peace

THE PILLARS OF PEACE

IEP has developed an innovative conceptual framework to uncover the attitudes, institutions and structures that underpin peaceful societies. It has found that these same factors are associated with many other desirable qualities such as resilience and competitive business environments. Derived from expert statistical analysis of over 4,000 cross-country data sets, the Pillars of Peace provides a roadmap to overcome adversity and conflict and build sustainable peace.

VIOLENCE CONTAINMENT SPENDING

IEP's economic modelling and statistical analysis has demonstrated peace to have a significant economic value. Our research detailing the cost of preventing and dealing with the consequences of violence constitutes one of the first comprehensive and systematic attempts to aggregate the global costs of violence.

This unique analysis and data allows for country-specific calculations, scalable to 99.6% of the world's population, on the impact of violence on GDP and the potential additional economic activity that would stem from reductions in violence.

RISK ANALYSIS

IEP has developed Bayesian statistical models to predict changes in peace. The models allow deep understanding of the resilience of nations towards internal and external shocks and can be used for forecasting risk and opportunity, early conflict warning and for conflict assessment. The models are used by business, intergovernmental and academic organisations.
